Communication Division Meeting – December 7, 2021

It is important to recognize the 80th anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor in 1941 and the loss of so many service members and civilians. May the good Lord care for their souls.

- The meeting was called to order at 1900hrs by Jeff K9DYR and all stood and recited the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.
- There were 19 members in attendance and one visitor Marvin KF9NL from Gaston IN.
- Gary-W9GNR reported on the ARES volunteer hours. In October there were 227 volunteer hours and in November there were 240 volunteer hours. The total for 2021 through November is 3,253 volunteer hours. Thanks to all the members who turned out for all of our events.
- Gary provided a list of nets for the surrounding counties during the week and encouraged members to check in with neighboring counties.
- Jeff -K9DYR advised the group that there were no Outreach Programs for December. He also is looking of assistance with the new shipment of Outreach pamphlets that need to be broken down and packaged as hand outs
- Training of the EOC Team is continuing ahead of the State Level Exercise in June. This is a 3 day exercise hosted by Madison County EMA in Madison County involving the State EMA and several other counties. Radio operators will be required and EMA is looking for volunteers to spend a day not necessarily all three days. There is a 'Wish List' for EMA to purchase GoBoxes for such situations. Although many Radio operators have personal Go Boxes, during an incident or exercise, once the Operator is relieved for the next shift his Go Box would packed up and taken with him forcing the next shift to set up from scratch. With EMA provided Go Boxes, the first person to the site wold set up the Go Box and all following shifts would continue working with that set up. The last Operator when the incident/exercise was over would tear sown the setup and return the equipment to EMA.
- Dale KV9W reported for the Warning group that the month of December would be cycles of warm weather approaching 60° and cold weather near or below 20°. Snow or rain would be determined by what cycle we are in.
- Jeff-K9DYR reminded everyone to continue working on their Task Books. He also reminded the group to continue to pursue completing the FEMA training.
- The remainder of the evening was an After Action discussion of the Run the Mounds event. Many discussions centered on various antennas, which worked and which presented problems. Sever operators learned more of their radio in the open area to include the 'Lock' button. Those that were participants of the run, are looking forward to the White River run in the spring/summer.
